2014 Awards and Recognition Annual Report

1. State Awards co-chairs and District Vice President were mailed a description of responsibilities for awards and recognition.
2. Procedures for submitting awards was updated to reflex deadline dates and mailed to District Vice Presidents and members.
3. District Vice-Presidents were asked to encourage member agents to plan for submitting awards as they were working on their end of year reporting.
4. Group A and B Awards chairpersons received information about awards judging process, state judging sheets, and awards information & national judging sheets from NEAFCS by mail and email attachments.
5. Assisted NCEAFCS Webmaster in updating the information for Award application procedures for posting on the NCEAFCS web page.
6. The State President mailed, Group A and Group B committees and District Vice Presidents the award scorecard and all necessary information for scoring the awards.
7. Eligible applications were forwarded to NEAFCS Awards and Recognition Chairperson for judging at National level.
8. Thirteen Plaques were ordered from Trophies and Tributes: (4) 9 x 12 plaque for the Distinguished Service, Continued Excellence, and State President Awards; and (9) 8 x 10 plaques for winners of the Youth Award [1], Early Career Award [2], [1], Community Partnership Award [1], Communication Award- Television/Video [1], Past President's Award [1], Human Development Award [1], Dean Don Felkner Financial Management Award, [1], Mary M. Wells, Memorial Diversity Award, [1].
9. All awards recipients received information about the state awards presentations from the District and State Vice President for Awards, and were encouraged to invite their CED, DED, and guests for the Awards Banquet.
10. Summary statements were emailed, as an attachment, to planning committee of the state meeting in order to be published in the state meeting program.
11. State award winners will be posted on the NCEAFCS website following the state meeting.
12. National winners will be posted after the NEAFCS meeting. North Carolina has three, association members who will be recognized at the NEAFCS national and regional meeting as winners of the Distinguished Service award [2], and Continued Excellence [1].
